RECIPIENT OBLIGATIONS:

- Due to uncertainties caused by the pandemic, DMSAS this year recognizes that we need to be flexible insofar as what has traditionally been a required 10 week in-person internship. We are committed to preserving the internship opportunity in some form, either in-person or virtual, with duration to be determined. The office will work with the Fellowship Awardee during the latter half of the spring semester to determine the format, nature and schedule for a summer 2021 internship opportunity.
- Provide documentation of completed Fellowship to DMSAS and School of Architecture.
- Give presentation/exhibit on Fellowship to School of Architecture during 2020 Fall Semester.
- Give presentation on Fellowship to DMSAS during final academic year or after graduation.
