AT THE YALE SCHOOL OF ARCHITECTURE
2021

AWARD:

A \$10,000 stipend for travel and independent research during the summer of 2021. Paid internship opportunity with David M. Schwarz Architects (DMSAS) in Washington, DC.

ELIGIBILITY:

An annual award open to Graduate students who are completing their final year of study.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- Statement of Intent for Travel and Research
- Proposed Summer Schedule for Internship and Travel
- Estimated Budget for Use of Travel Stipend
- Resume
- Portfolio

Submit applications digitally on Ruby:

1. Go to <http://ruby.architecture.yale.edu>
2. In the top right corner of the page, click 'My Registration Page'
3. At the bottom of that page, under 'Submissions', click 'Make a new submission'
4. Click Browse, Choose a PDF file no larger than 50MB
5. Under Studio, choose the proper collection
6. Click Submit

Note: Ruby is only available on campus. For off campus access, you will need to have an active VPN connection.

TIMELINE:

- Applications due by 9:00 AM Monday March 1, 2021.
- Award announcement by early April.

RECIPIENT OBLIGATIONS:

- *Due to uncertainties caused by the pandemic, DMSAS this year recognizes that we need to be flexible insofar as what has traditionally been a required 10 week in-person internship. We are committed to preserving the internship opportunity in some form, either in-person or virtual, with duration to be determined. The office will work with the Fellowship Awardee during the latter half of the spring semester to determine the format, nature and schedule for a summer 2021 internship opportunity.*
- *Travel shall occur prior to the 10 week internship.*
- *Provide documentation of completed Fellowship to DMSAS and School of Architecture.*
- *Give presentation/exhibit on Fellowship to School of Architecture during 2020-2021 academic year.*
- *Give presentation on Fellowship to DMSAS following the 10 week internship.*

Note: Due to the required work component of the Fellowship and the length of time it takes to obtain a work permit, this award is open only to American citizens or permanent residents. Funding for travel is intended to be the primary use of the stipend. Any remaining monies may be used for the recipient's educational expenses including tuition, books and fees. DMSAS will award the stipend through the School of Architecture who will oversee its direct dispensation. Travel to/from Washington, DC and housing & living expenses are at recipient's expense.
